APPLIANCE GUARDING

Guards Protect

Guards are designed to protect, not hinder from direct contact with moving parts

Interlocking Guards

Kitchen appliances are commonly equipped with interlocking guards. It prohibits the machine from operating until the guard is in place such as on commercial blenders



Never Place Hands into Moving Parts

Before removing items or unjamming equipment the item should be de-energized

If Guards are Missing Do Not Use

Do not use any equipment with missing parts or guarding

Use equipment only as intended

Use equipment for its intended purpose and always find the right equipment for the job

Take the Time to do the Task Correctly

Even if protective measures increase the time it takes to do a task, take proper precautions to do so

Interlock Guard

What are interlocking guards?

Guards that must be in place for the machine to operate. This is the type of guarding on many kitchen appliances such as commercial mixers and a microwa

Inspection

What are examples of items that should be inspected prior to using an appliance?

- Guards are in place
- All proper parts and pieces are in place
- Screws and other connecting devices are in place and secure
