



CLASSROOM DECORATING

DO ✓	DON'T ✗
Minimize clutter and organize the classroom including decorations, materials and equipment.	Overlook potential areas of concern and keep adding to the issue creating potential fire, trip or evacuation hazards.
Use fire resistant LED lighting if adding light to the classroom including lamps and string lights. These types of bulbs use 75% less energy.	Ignore lighting and bulb types possibly overloading the outlets and generating more energy and heat than necessary.
Organize the classroom working to eliminate trip hazards such as flipped up rugs or cords strung across walkways.	Leave trip hazards in place instead of securing, clearing, replacing, or reporting areas of concern.
Use appropriate hooks or fasteners to hang decorations or lighting.	Hang items from light fixtures, ceiling tiles or sprinkler heads and pipes.
Work to minimize electrical use in the classroom so as not to overload outlets considering power strips, extension cords, equipment, lighting appliances etc.	Continue adding on to the electrical use with more power strips and cords without paying attention to equipment and appliances that use considerable amounts of energy.
Provide increased fresh air and fans for ventilation when needed.	Use heated plug-in scents that can overheat when empty causing a fire hazard.
